



CALYLOPHUS HARTWEGII V. FENDLERI SUNDROPS

Native to a large area of the Southwest and Plains, this mounding woody perennial blooms during the spring and summer with clear yellow flowers. These blossoms have a 24 hour life span, opening at night and fading to a orange-pink by late afternoon. This perennial grows quickly to about 12 inches tall by 2 feet wide. Prune back in early spring if it becomes too woody, or suffers frost damage. Plant Sundrops in well-drained soil, and be careful not to over water. Like the *Oenothera* species, it is very susceptible to flea beetles, but they are easily controlled with common insecticides. Hardy to - 20° F. USDA Zone 5.
