



VAUQUELINIA CORYMBOSA V. HETERODON NARROW LEAF ROSEWOOD

Narrow leaf rosewood is a large, long-lived evergreen shrub or small tree to 10 to 25 feet tall and wide. The glossy green leaves are long and narrow. Clusters of creamy-white flowers appear from May through July. This shrub is native to southwest Texas and northern Mexico, along mountainsides from 5000 to 6500 in elevation. It may be trained as a multi-trunk tree or left to grow naturally as a windbreak, hedge, or a large, informal shrub. Narrow leaf rosewood is tolerant of most well-drained soils. It prefers full sun exposures. Hardy to 0° F, USDA Zone 6.
