



## ZEPHYRANTHES SPECIES RAIN LILY

Rain Lily forms a clump to about 12 inches tall and wide, with narrow, glossy, dark green leaves. From mid-summer to early fall, it is covered with flowers in response to changes in moisture. These little beauties are tolerant of a wide range of soils, exposures, and irrigation schedules, and are grown in many parts of the country. In the southwest desert, rain lilies prefer some shade and supplemental irrigation in the summer months. If plants burn to the ground in the heat, don't worry. They will recover from underground bulbs when water is applied, or as temperatures cool off. Some are evergreen in the winter, and tolerate temperatures as low as 0°F. Zephyrantes come in a multitude of colors including white, yellow, pink, and apricot. USDA Zone 7.
