



Mangave 'Silver Fox' P.P.A.F.

Mangaves are new hybrid plants that are just starting to gain interest in the market for their hardiness, faster growth rate, and many unique forms. Mangaves are a cross between Manfredas and Agaves, and try to pair some of the best parts of both genera. 'Silver Fox' has silvery-blue leaves with a thick, waxy coating, giving it the appearance of glowing white. Purple spotting is visible under the coating, and is more pronounced if plants are getting full sun or at least afternoon sun. The arching habit of this selection has leaves that are lined with marginal teeth, but not as sharp as Agaves. Plants will do great planted in a xeric landscape, and do quite well in containers as well.
