



Agave chrysantha Golden Flowered Century Plant

This generally solitary agave is native to central Arizona at elevations from 3000 to 6000 feet. The bold, upright leaves are deeply channeled and range from blue-gray to green in color. Mature size for the plant is about 3 feet tall by 5 feet wide. The branched flower stalk produces glorious clusters of bright gold flowers, and an abundance of nectar. It will die after flowering and will need to be replaced. Plant in full sun, provide good drainage, and treat for agave snout weevil as necessary. Hardy to about 5° F. USDA Zone 7.
