



## Agave palmeri Palmer's Agave

This mid- to high-elevation agave forms a compact rosette of blue-green lance-shaped leaves. The leaves measure 2 feet long by up to 4 inches wide, with reddish teeth along the margins and a sharp terminal spine. This plant is solitary in the wild, but sometimes produces offsets under cultivation. A branched flower stalk to 18 feet tall has clusters of light, green flowers. Plant in full sun and well-drained soil. It is native throughout much of the Southwest.
