



## Agave parryi v. truncata Artichoke Agave

The dense symmetrical form and wide blue-grey leaves make this one of the most ornamental agaves available. The characteristic form resembles that of an artichoke. Found only along the Durango-Zacatecas border in Mexico, this agave grows in grasslands at 7500 feet in elevation. This plant produces many offsets, forming large colonies. A tall branching flower spike holds clusters of golden yellow flowers. Artichoke agave tolerates a wide range of soils and exposures.
