



Agave victoria-reginae Queen Victoria Agave

This petite agave is one of the best choices for small planting areas or containers. Its short, stout leaves are deep green with white markings, and form a tight rosette to 18 inches across. Queen Victoria agave is very slow growing and long-lived, taking many years to reach flowering size. As with most agaves, the mother plant will expire after flowering but it will often produce numerous offsets. Plant in full sun and water sparingly to maintain the tightest form. This species is native to the Chihuahuan Desert, at elevations from 4000 to 5000 feet.
