



Lantana montevidensis 'White' White Trailing Lantana

This tough native of South America quickly forms a low mounding groundcover with dark green, aromatic rough-textured foliage. During periods of cool weather the foliage tends to take on a purplish tinge. Clusters of white flowers cover the plant in the warm months, followed by small bluish berries that are poisonous to humans. The trailing growth habit makes this plant useful for landscaping raised planters or slopes. It tolerates full sun, reflected heat, smog, poor soil and drought. Cut back any frost-damaged foliage in the spring.
