



## Psilostrophe cooperi Paper Flower

Paper Flower is native to Arizona, California, New Mexico and into Mexico at elevations from 2000 to 5000 feet. The leaves are needle-like and grey-green in color. Paper Flower forms rounded mounds about 2 feet in diameter. In the spring and summer masses of small yellow flowers are produced. The flowers dry to a papery tan color and persist for a long time. Plant in full sun and extremely well-drained soils. Groups well with other native plantings like *Penstemons*, *Agaves*, and *Justicias*. Hardy to 10° F, USDA Zone 8.
