

Tetraneuris acaulis (syn. Hymenoxys acaulis) Angelita Daisy, Four Nerve Daisy

Angelita daisy is an excellent perennial, providing a splash of gold all year in low desert gardens. It is native to rocky slopes and dry mesas across the Southwest, at elevations ranging from 4000 to 7000 feet. At higher elevations, the color will be concentrated in the summer months. This compact, dense little perennial forms a clump of slender, grass-like leaves to 12 inches tall by 15 inches wide. Yellowgold daisy blossoms perch above the foliage on tall, leafless stems. Angelita daisy should be planted in full sun and well-drained soil. It will go dormant when temperatures drop below about 10° F. Due to the long bloom period, old seed heads can cause it to look scruffy. Removing spent flowers every few months will keep the plants looking fresh.
