



## Vauquelinia corymbosa ssp. angustifolia Chisos Rosewood, Narrow Leaf Rosewood

This subspecies of *Vauquelinia corymbosa* is native to the Chisos Mountains of the Trans-Pecos range of southwest Texas occurring at elevations of 3000 to 5000 feet. Its leaves are more slender and sharply toothed than the species. This evergreen shrub is sometimes called the narrow leaf rosewood. Otherwise it has similar characteristics, with flattened clusters of white flowers produced in the spring. Chisos Rosewood can be sheared periodically to keep it smaller.
