



Zephyranthes candida White Rain Lily

White Rain Lily forms a clump to about 12 inches tall and wide, with narrow, glossy, dark green leaves. From mid-summer to early fall, it is covered with white flowers in response to changes in moisture. These little beauties are tolerant of a wide range of soils, exposures, and irrigation schedules, and are grown in many parts of the country. In the Southwest desert, rain lilies prefer some shade and supplemental irrigation in the summer months. This species will usually hold its leaves through the summer when some other species will go drought deciduous. White Rain Lily will also generally hold its leaves through all but the coldest winters. Hardy to 0°F, USDA Zone 7.
